As the courtroom deputies begin rescheduling hearings, we know attorneys will need to meet with their clients and that will take time. We created a new event for defense counsel to use after meeting with clients. If your client agrees to a video conference hearing, docket: **Notice to Judge from Attorney - Client Consents to Video Conference**. (This is a text-only entry so no document is required.) This event informs the courtroom deputies that you met with your client, and that he/she will consent on the record to a video conference hearing. After this event is filed, it will prompt the courtroom deputy to schedule the hearing and coordinate the video conference with the detention facility if the defendant is in custody.
